What is the Message of Easter?

The Christian faith, according to the Creeds of the Church (those recognized in the Lutheran Confessions as the Three Ecumenical Creeds - The Apostles' Creed, The Nicene Creed, and The Athanasian Creed), hinges on two miraculous truths of the story of Jesus. Although I suppose it could be possible to call yourself a Christian and not believe these truths, for me and more importantly for orthodox Christianity, these are non-negotiable. I'll speak here for myself and say that I cannot understand how one could confess Christian faith and not believe both of these. These two central points of Christian doctrine are the Virgin conception and birth of Jesus and the bodily resurrection of Jesus from the dead.

While the Gospel accounts of Jesus' life and ministry record what we believe are three years' worth of teachings and events, the Creeds really focus on just these two points of faith - the Virgin Birth and the Resurrection.

> Jesus was . . . Conceived by the Holy Spirit,

Born of the Virgin Mary

and he . . .

suffered under Pontius Pilate was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again: He ascended into heaven . . .

Here we are . . . on the verge of Holy Week and Easter once again. Here we are, ready to relive this story that is the story of God's gift of life for us. We can look at it as one extended story. We can break it down into parts and pieces as we do in the many worship services over the eight days of Holy Week - Palm Sunday . . . Maundy

Thursday . . . Good Friday . . . and then the glorious Resurrection of our Lord on Easter Sunday.

What does it mean for you? I know that you know the story. You've known it as long as you've known anything - Jesus was crucified and, on the third day, was raised from the dead. But what does it mean for you? What difference does it make in vour life?

As I talk with people who are nearing their own deaths and as I talk with family members and friends of people who are dying or have already died and we're planning funeral services, one of the things I say most often is "Death will not and cannot have the last word." That is so important for us because, in this life, death is all around us. COVID-19 confronted us with our own mortality and with the threat of death. The news stories each and every day from Ukraine confronts us with the harsh reality of death. We have beloved family members and friends getting older and having to deal with a variety of health concerns and, yes, there it is again, death looms over all of it. None of us are getting out of here any other way but through death, but death will not have the last word over us. THAT is the message of Easter. As God raised Jesus, so we have this very precious promise that we, too, will be raised to new life in Jesus. We believe in . . . the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

We will have our struggles. We will suffer here and now in this life with illness and with accident, with diseases that are physical, mental, and emotional. We will be challenged by the terrible stories of what human beings do to each other in their selfish desires for wealth and power. Death is real but, in Jesus Christ, we have the victory. In his rising from the dead Jesus has conquered death and his victory is gifted to us. The power of Easter, the truth of Easter,

the message of Easter is that death will not and cannot have the last word over us as we trust in the gift of God's grace, mercy, and love in Jesus Christ.

So, whatever it is you wrestle with in these days . . . whatever your worries or anxieties might be . . . be assured that, in Christ's rising from the dead, you have the promise that death has, ultimately, been defeated and life wins - for you and for those you love. Thanks be to God!

Easter 2022 - No Idle Tale

"I love to tell the story..." So goes the great old hymn. But the world is filled with stories today, that are tough to tell. As Covid lingers. As the war in Ukraine breaks our heart. What's next? And will it be worse? Just as much, I worry: can we trust each other anymore? Trust enough to share any kind of news, and believe it, together? Do we still hold in common, any of the assumptions, beliefs, and causes we used to share? Or is our world now filled only with suspicions and deceptions — "fake news" from all sources, on all sides?

On that first Easter Sunday, still overshadowed by Good Friday, bleakness and distrust were also all around. Even when those energized, overjoyed women burst in, announcing the most amazing thing they had ever seen and heard – HIS TOMB IS EMPTY! JESUS IS RISEN! – even then, "all the rest" dismissed their report as nothing more than "an idle tale" (Luke 24:11).

We are the church. We are called to be different. If the prevailing winds of our world today are seeking to blow us apart, the Holy Spirit winds us back together. God calls us to come to the places of sadness and sickness and doubt and despair – where all hope is dead and buried – and be ready to be amazed. Ready to see (and say!) what was dead – is now ALIVE. What was lost – is now FOUND. What was impossible – is now POSSIBLE. Real. True. And trustworthy. Jesus is risen, and we shall arise. The Bible prophets foretold it. Jesus said it, again and again. But almost nobody could trust it. Until God made it true, and sent people out to spread the word, the good news, the gospel. God is still sending us today. This Easter Sunday is like the first: a world full of doubt and distrust. A world full of conflict and separation. In the midst of it all, Christ is standing here with us. The Holy Spirit is in us and giving us courage. And God is making all things new, even now.


