Even as I'm seeing these spring flowers in bloom, I'm seeing the first shoots of the summer flowers that are still to come, the hostas and the Stella D'Oro day lilies. These beautiful signs of new life come on us in these weeks as we continue to celebrate the gift of God's saving grace, of forgiveness, life and salvation in the resurrection of Jesus Christ our Savior and Lord. We brought that beauty into our sanctuaries to celebrate Christ's victory over sin and death on Easter Sunday and now, if you're like me, you've added those Easter flowers to your garden plots at your house. As we move through the month of May, through these Sundays of the Easter season, look around you. Be

Let folks know they are not alone, that they have not been forgotten, and that they are loved. Jesus is alive raised from the dead! Bring the light of life, the joy of the Lord with you everywhere you go!

What's it like to be a Pastoral Intern in NEPA? By Melissa Hrdlicka

It is hard to believe I have been on internship with Common Ground Recovery Community for nine months already! My time with Common Ground has been a deep blessing to me and to my education. I have witnessed the presence of God in the open vulnerable sharing during our Wednesday worship, in the heartfelt reverent "thank you's" when serving communion and meals in downtown Reading and in our study of the scriptures and 12-steps. Common Ground truly is a place of radical love and where God's grace embraces our brokenness.

As part of my internship project, I invited our worshiping communities and ministry partners to reflect on these three questions: What does Common Ground mean to you? What does community mean to you? And where do you see God here and in the world? They then drew on white cotton squares that will be sewn together to make an altar cloth to fit all of our communion tables. The responses were profound and beautiful!

There are drawings of stick figures holding hands around the globe, animals peacefully living together, a place of refuge in the storm and in the desert, flowers, hearts, and crosses. There are phrases like, "Freedom, break the chains", "God is love", "We are better together", "Never give up hope because there is hope in everything", and so much more on these 33 squares!

As these squares are knit together to make one, we are reminded that God weaves all of us together in a tapestry of love to bring warmth, comfort, grace, and peace to a weary world! May we live out this good news and may it spill over into thanksgiving! (Colossians 2:2-7)


