

From the Pastor's Desk -

September 2022 "Lifelong Learning"

⁴ "Hear, O Israel: The LORD is our God, the LORD alone. ⁵ You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might. ⁶ Keep these words that I am commanding you today in your heart. ⁷ Recite them to your children and talk about them when you are at home and when you are away, when you lie down and when you rise. 8 Bind them as a sign on your hand, fix them as an emblem on your forehead, ' write them on the doorposts of your house and on your

Deuteronomy 6:4-8 (NRSV)

As I write these words, the new school year is still ahead of us, but not by much. In just a few days our children and our grandchildren will be headed off to school - to elementary school, to middle school, to high school, or to college. They will be taught things they do not know. They will be challenged with tasks they have never had to do before. They will be confronted with new ideas, new ways of seeing the world and understanding other people. It will not be easy. It may be easier for some than for others, but that speaks to the remarkable diversity that is the human race. We are all different. We are unique individuals who learn in our own unique ways. This is true for the basic instruction of elementary school and middle school, but it is also true for the more advanced material taught in high school and college. It is true to say that we are all learning, every minute or every day. as we take in the world around us and as we meet new people in new situations.

All of this is no less true here in the church. Christian education - being taught and learning the things of God and of God's Word - is a lifelong process. Living as a child of God means being open to what God is saying to us through all of the varied experiences of life.

In our baptismal liturgy, parents bringing their children to the font are asked to make this promise for their children:

To live with them among God's faithful people,

bring them to the word of God and the holy supper,

teach them the Lord's Prayer, the Creed, and the Ten Commanmdments. place in their hands the holy scriptures, and nurture them in faith and prayer, so that your children may learn to trust God, proclaim Christ through word and deed, care for others and the world God made, and work for justice and peace.

In the church of my childhood, as here, there was no programmed Christian education once a young person had been confirmed. There was no Sunday School class for high school or college age students. There was no adult Sunday School. It was almost as if we had all been told that we had learned everything there was to learn about God and living our faith by the time we were

thirteen years old. How absurd!

While it is vitally important, as we read in the passage from Deuteronomy above, to teach God's Word to our children, that God's Word needs to be part of our home and family life; as adults we need ongoing learning, ongoing educational opportunities, if we are to manage all of the changes and challenges of life as people of God in Jesus Christ. The Bible stories, the simple lessons taught to us as young children, will not be a sufficient foundation for living out our faith in today's world. We need to be in God's Word, to be talking with one another about the difficult issues we face in life, if we are to stand firm in the faith.

Leading Bible study for our adults is one of the most enjoyable aspects of my ministry as your pastor. At the same time, one of my great disappointments is how few of our members take advantage of the opportunities presented to them. Between

our two congregations, two Bible study groups meet each week — Monday afternoons from 1:30-3:00p.m. at St. Matthew's and Thursday mornings from 10:30a.m. til 12:00noon. I've offered evening opportunities, but they have not been successful. The groups we have are not large but those participating have found great value in the learning, the sharing, and the Christian fellowship and support we offer to each other. I invite you to consider being a part of one of these groups if they work with your schedule.

Rally Day 2022 is Sunday September 11 at St. Matthew's, the kickoff to a new Sunday School year. Alas, in these COVID and post-COVID years we have not been able to hold Sunday School at Holy Trinity. Our Bible studies resume after our summer hiatus the week following September 11 -Monday, the 12th at St. Matthew's and Thursday, the 15th at Holy Trinity. Life as the people of God, as disciples of Jesus Christ is all about lifelong learning. Please challenge yourselves to get into the Word of God in your own devotional reading and study or in some group. The challenges we face in this life require us to build on a firm foundation and there is no firmer foundation than we have in Jesus Christ and in God's Word in the Holy Scriptures.

So Noah went out with his sons and his wife and his sons' wives. And every animal, every creeping thing, and every bird, everything that moves on the earth, went out of the ark by families.... God said, "This is the sign of the covenant that I make between me and you and every living creature that is with you, for all future generations: I have set my bow in the clouds, and it shall be a sign of the covenant between me and the earth."

(Genesis 8:18-19; 9:12-13)

Following the flood – a disaster horrific in scope and cause – God brought forth a time and a place, where healing and renewal could begin. Have you ever felt overwhelmed and unable to cope with a situation? There have been times during covid that many have felt that way—worry about those who were sick—concerned for families who had lost someone. It was hard enough for adults—but what about children? Camp Noah is a Lutheran camping organization run out of Minnesota that provides weeklong camp experiences for children who have experienced traumatizing natural disasters like tornados, floods, hurricanes—and covid. This past summer, just such a camp was held in Oley, PA. Camp Noah provided a week of fun and engaging experiences through books, crafts, music, art, and games that allowed kids to express their feelings and concerns regarding covid.
