From the Pastor – October 2022 "Pray Always & Don't Lose Heart"



Then Jesus told them a parable about their need to pray always and not to lose heart.

Luke 18:1 (NRSV)

Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

Philippians 4:4-7 (NRSV)

Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances, for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.

I Thessalonians 5:16-18 (NRSV)

It becomes clear, as we read the New Testament, both the Gospels and the letters, that the first generation of Christians, the Apostles and those who heard the message of Christ through their ministry, believed with certainty that Jesus would be coming back soon. It was a confident hope. It was good news. Their Savior would return to usher in the promised Kingdom of God in which the crucified, risen, and ascended Jesus would be Lord of all. In his Kingdom the redeemed people of God would be raised from death and live forever.

That hope sustained God's people, the Body of Christ, through all manner of struggle and suffering, through oppression and persecution. The authorities and powers here on earth were finite while God's authority and power were infinite, as seen in the glorious resurrection of Jesus. Not even death can separate us from the loving presence of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

But why hadn't he returned yet? Even by

the end of the first century questions were being asked. Opponents and critics of the community of God's people in Christ came to ridicule the believers for this hope that appeared never to be fulfilled.

It is in the context of this hope in the ultimate victory of Christ as Lord that we read about how God's people should pray. From Luke 18 – "Pray always and don't lose heart." From Philippians 4 – "The Lord is near. Don't be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer . . . let your requests be made known to God." From I Thessalonians 5 – "Pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances." Even when there is a sense of uncertainty . . REJOICE! and be faithful in prayer. The Lord is near. Don't worry. Don't be anxious. Don't lose heart.

In Luke's Gospel, both in chapter 11 and chapter 18, we have stories from Jesus that point to persistence, to praying and not giving up, to having a confidence that God will answer our prayers in his good time, that we will receive what we need from God's gracious and abundant store of blessing.

We live by faith and not by sight. That's not always (if ever) easy. We trust in what we cannot see. We believe in the promises of God even when the circumstances we face, our situations here and now, may seem to argue otherwise. Press on! Keep the faith! Our prayers are the active living out of our very real relationship with God. We trust in God's presence. We believe he is with us and so we live open to his presence and constant in our conversation, in this ongoing dialog we have with our Heavenly Father.

The parables Jesus tells in Luke convey this message that persistence, that perseverance in prayer will ultimately pay off. The more I think of those stories, the more I realize how similar this is to my 9 year old grandson, Bryan. When he wants something — a new Lego set, a toy truck or tractor, or simply some of my time to play with him . . .

he knows the power of persistence. He stays at me (at all of us). He never gives up. He inevitably wears us out and wears us down until he gets what he wants. Is that a model for my prayer life, for your prayer life? It seems to be the message of the stories Jesus tells. Pray. PRAY. PRAY constantly. PRAY constantly and don't ever give up.

The point isn't really about getting what we want, but about living all of life with a sure and certain sense of God's loving and gracious presence. Whatever is on our minds and hearts - at any time of day - let God know. Share your life with the ONE who has loved you into life through Jesus Christ. Our hope is not in the things of this world and this life but in God's promises. Cling to your Savior and Lord and know that your life is safe in God, no matter what.

* 2023 Update on Portico Health Rates & Plan Changes

ELCA-Primary health contribution baseline rate will increase 3%, the same rate increase as last year, which was the lowest in eight years. The 3% increase also applies to sponsored members receiving the ELCA Medicare-Primary health benefit Standard option. ELCA-Primary Gold+ option deductibles will increase to \$1,500 for member only, \$2,250 for member and child(ren) and \$3,000 for member and spouse or member, spouse, and child(ren). Coinsurance, out-of-pocket limits and prescription drug cost-share will not change.

* Prepare for 2023 Annual Enrollment



As you prepare to make selections in October, keep these things in mind: Sponsoring employers (congregations and organizations) will select the option they will offer their employees Oct. 3-14. Your registered EmployerLink user can access the 2023 Decision Guide and their Custom Comparison Report to help determine 2023 costs and options. Note: any organization that does not make a selection will be assigned Silver+ (A) to offer their plan members the ability to choose the coverage that works best for them. Sponsored members, watch for an email from Portico with specific information about 2023 Annual Enrollment, including when your selection period will be

open.
