

From the Pastor's Desk – July 2023 "The Whole Armor of God"

10 Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his power; 11 put on the whole armor of God, so that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil, 12 for our electronic struggle is not against blood and flesh but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers of this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places. 13 Therefore take up the whole armor of God, so that you may be able to withstand on the evil day and, having prevailed against everything, to stand firm. 14 Stand, therefore, and belt your waist with truth and put on the breastplate of righteousness 15 and lace up your sandals in preparation for the gospel of peace. 16 With all of these, take the shield of faith, with which you will be able to quench all the flaming arrows of the evil one. 17 Take the helmet of salvation and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God. 18 Pray in the Spirit at all times in every prayer and supplication. To that end, keep alert and always persevere in supplication for all the saints.

This month we get to enjoy one of the real blessings of summer church life at St. Matthew's – Vacation Bible School. It's been a long, long – much too long – time since we've had our own Vacation Bible School program. I'd like to say that COVID has been the culprit but it goes back even further than that. I am grateful to Nancy Ahner, who has a really great track record of directing VBS at St. Matthew's, for stepping up once again to direct this year's program. Grateful, also of course, to all those who have volunteered to be involved in leadership for VBS this year. An added bonus and blessing is that Pastor Dana Heckman-Beil, one of St. Matthew's

own, will be joining us that week and she will be bringing some of her young people to help with the program. Pr. Dana is pastor of Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in Ashland, Schuylkill County.

Our VBS program this year is entitled, "Keepers of the Kingdom". In that theme of knights and adventures is reference to The Whole Armor of God, the passage from the sixth chapter of the Letter to the Ephesians. How do we live our lives as the people of God in Jesus Christ and face the challenges of this day and age, all that would oppose God's Word and those of us for whom it is the authoritative truth about God, ourselves. and the way we are called to live our lives? The Apostles instructs us to "be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his power." We need to armor ourselves - think of the suit of armor worn by knights heading out to battle back in the day.

It is, for me, significant that nearly all of the armor mentioned here in this passage is defensive rather than offensive. The armor we are instructed to put on is for our protection from those who would attack us – God will protect and defend us. Too often, it seems, Christians go attacking those with whom we disagree as if that is our primary mission. It's not. The only thing that could we called an offensive weapon is "the sword of the Spirit, which is the Word of God." God's Word does not attack. God's Word is always a word of gracious welcome, a word of God's saving love for sinners like us.

Again, I thank God for raising up leaders for us so that we might have a Vacation Bible School at St. Matthew's this summer. It is my hope that families from Holy Trinity will take advantage of this program as well. The program is open to all, to members of every church and even no church at all. We hope that this will be a time of learning for our children, of growing in faith and in trusting in God's saving love no matter what we experience in life. We have God's

promise in Christ that, through the Holy Spirit, we are never without God's presence in our lives – that God never leaves us or forsakes us.




OF NORTHERN STITCHES, CONTAINER SHIPS, PORT CHAP-LAINS AND SEAFARERS: A JOURNEY OF HOPE THRU SIH

t is a Thursday morning at Calvary Lutheran Church in Bemidji, MN. Canada is just 107 miles away. The winter morning is brisk, 7 degrees, with a stiff breeze out of the north. This means it feels like way too many degrees below zero. For the 8 to 10 women who are here, cold temps, icy winds, even blowing snow can't keep them home. The call to serve others through the art and craft of quilting is too compelling. Colors surround them, blues and greens, browns and oranges, reds, yellows, floral and stripe, squares and scraps, piecing together discarded fabric into warmth which becomes shawls and tents, blankets, a wedding dress, maybe even a death wrap for those fleeing war or the ravages of climate change. But here in the north, it is simply the joy of community and service.

Today I imagine the journey the quilts will take, from the cold north to a warehouse, into a container bound for a need somewhere in the world. Ukraine or Lebanon? Mali or Burkina Faso? I imagine them loaded onto a train or truck on its way to a port, part of the Seafarers International House (SIH) network. Baltimore? Newark? Seafarers international House (SIH), the ELCA seafarers' ministry, has been that intersection where quilters from Bemidji, connect to a port chaplain, a seafarer, a dock worker loading up a container ship bound for somewhere across the Atlantic, through the Panama Canal, to places known and unknown.





For 150 years, hospitality and the welcome of strangers, support for seafarers and newcomers and refugees and immigrants, asylum seekers, this ministry has been a tapestry, a quilt, a piecing together of connection, support and a wayside rest. Perhaps some of the ancestors of these quilting women were assisted by SIH as they disembarked at Battery Park or Ellis Island, bound for a new home in a new land.

This is what interests me on a cold Thursday morning, how the stitches of these women, intersect with a dock worker, a seafarer, a port chaplain, an asylum seeker. This is why I continue to financially support this ministry and serve on its board with great joy, imagining and underwriting the hope, the intersections of strangers around the globe, all uniquely made possible through SIH. .







The Northeastern Pennsylvania Synod met in assembly from June 1-3, 2023 at Kalahari Resort in the Poconos. We gathered around Word and Sacrament, Song, Service, friendship, and food. We prayed together, worshipped together, and conducted the business of Christ's church for the first time, in-person, in three years!
