## From the Pastor's Desk – January 2024

### "What Can I Give Him?"

2 In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, magi from the east came to Jerusalem, <sup>2</sup> asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star in the east and have come to pay him homage."

10 When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. 11 On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother, and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. 12 And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.

We've just come through the biggest season of gift-giving in the year. Most of us, I dare say, struggled to come up with ideas for a number of people among our family and friends. We feel the need to give everyone something, even when they don't really need anything and we can't come up with "the right thing" to give them. It's what we do. We have to give them something, right?

I've been working from that notion as I consider how to get more of our members involved in our church's life and ministry. It's about gifts — not the gifts we give but the gifts God has given us. The Apostle Paul writes quite a lot about spiritual gifts that God gives us as we work together to carry out the ministry of witness and service in our church and out into the community.

So often I hear folks tell me that they don't feel that they have gifts of any kind for service in the church. I beg to differ. Not all are called to be pastors or teachers. Not all have gifts for music, either singing or playing an instrument. In a former congregation, I had an active member, a church council member who was a middle school teacher. Clearly she had gifts for her calling in life but, as much as she taught a class of students every day, she could not/would not serve as a lector in church. She did many other things to benefit the life of that church but reading Scripture in the worship service was something she could not do.

What CAN you do? We need so many different tasks taken care of – things in our worship services and things during the week outside of worship. We need gifted leaders serving on church council and those with interests and abilities on our many committees (Worship & Music, Finance, Property, and others). We need new Worship Assistants to read the lessons and help with the distribution of the Sacrament. We need folks who love to sing to be a part of our choir.

In her beloved Christmas carol, Christina Rossetti asks the question: "What can I give him, poor as I am? That, so often, is our mindset. I'm poor. I don't have much. I can't do much. But you CAN. When our minds and hearts are set on offering God what we DO have and what we CAN do . . . there is so much we can offer to God in the life and ministry of our church.

It really is the truth of stewardship. So often we limit that word to money, to what we put in our envelopes each Sunday, but it's so much more than that – to time, talent, and treasure – as we used to say.

Here it is in the simplest, most basic terms – I need you – we need you – your church family needs you to do what you can. We need more Worship Assistants. We need committee members as we move into and

through this new year 2024. This is vitally important ministry for the good of your church.

Ask God in your daily prayers to show you how you can help your church. Please, ask me how you can help. You don't need to do everything, just that which you CAN do. Thank you for what you are doing and for letting me poke and prod just a little to bring about the growth in life and ministry we need.

## Worship in Collaboration with Oglala Sioux Nation

On November 12, 2023, St. Mark's Evangelical Lutheran Church, Birdsboro, PA, held their annual Native American worship service in honor of November being Native American Heritage Month. I attended the worship service and wanted to share my experience with you.

St. Mark's Lutheran Church has a partnership with the Oglala Sioux Nation of Native Americans in Pine Ridge Reservation, South Dakota, one of the poorest communities in the United States, and has been supporting them in many ways with their giving and their prayers.

In the worship service, the English translations used for the liturgy were:

Creator as the name used for God
Creator-Sets-Free as the name used for Jesus
The Chosen One as the name used for Christ
The Great Spirit as the name used for the Holy Spirit
The music for the worship service had a Native American vibe, words, and theme involving the sacredness of nature and life.

Copal incense from Central and Southwestern North America was used during the service as Native Americans used for sacred services.






Pr. Jim Farnsworth's message was dedicated to Native Americans and how the new immigrants treated them to America. He asked that we remember and honor those who have gone before us -- the original inhabitants of this land. He also asked that we have a right relationship with God and each other and that we have a responsibility to repair relations. We reconcile by learning the truth, loving each other, and breaking down barriers with others. He suggested that we learn the history of our area by looking through the eyes of our neighbors and that we are called to be good neighbors.
