# From the Pastor's Desk – February 2024

# "Ashes in the Shape of a Heart?"

<sup>17</sup> To Adam he said, "Because you listened to your wife and ate fruit from the tree about which I commanded you, 'You must not eat from it,'

"Cursed is the ground because of you; through painful toil you will eat food from it all the days of your life.

<sup>18</sup> It will produce thorns and thistles for you,

and you will eat the plants of the field.

<sup>19</sup> By the sweat of your brow you will eat your food until you return to the ground, since from it you were taken; for dust you are and to dust you will return."

(Genesis 3:17-19 NIV)

Ashes are a powerful symbol throughout the Scriptures. They speak of grief. They speak of loss. They speak of penitence. In the Book of Job we find them first as a sign of everything Job had lost. In all that he had suffered . . . "Job took a piece of broken pottery and scraped himself with it as he sat among the ashes." At the end of the book, after Job has been confronted by God and humbled in the encounter, he says, "Therefore I despise myself and repent in dust and ashes."

It is out of this tradition that the Church has come to use the language of ashes in our funeral liturgies: "In sure and certain hope of the resurrection to eternal life through our Lord Jesus Christ, we commend to almighty God our brother/sister\_\_\_\_, and we commit his/her body to its resting place; earth to earth, ashes to ashes, dust to dust."

We are finite creatures before the infinite God. We are mortal beings before the immortal God. As with Adam, so with us. We will die and return to the ground . . . for dust we are and to dust we will return.

So... Ash Wednesday. We begin the season of Lent with this ancient tradition that our foreheads are marked with ash in the sign of the cross as we hear the words, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." In this liturgy, in this smudge of ash, we are reminded of our mortality. In this liturgy, in this smudge of ash, we are reminded of the cost of Adam's sin and of our own sin. We will surely die.

By a curious coincidence of the calendar here in 2024, Ash Wednesday falls on February 14<sup>th</sup>, the date on which we celebrate Valentine's Day. How do we put these two commemorations together? Should the smudge of ash on our foreheads be in the shape of a heart this year? (Please understand that I'm kidding. Please.) The truth is, of course, that the shape of a cross is itself all about love and the lengths to which God's love for sinners has gone.


St. Valentine was, according to tradition, a 3<sup>rd</sup> Century priest (or bishop) who, against the decree of the emperor, ministered to persecuted Christians serving in the military of the Roman Empire and was martyred and buried on the 14<sup>th</sup> of February. It is said that, in his correspondence, he signed letters simply, Your Valentine. The Church has observed The Feast of St. Valentine since at least the eighth century.

So . . . Ash Wednesday and the beginning of yet another Lenten season is before us. Remember your mortality. Remember your sin. But all the more remember the love of God for you and for all sinners. For you Jesus gave up life and all things so that you might be reconciled in love to the Father.

# Advent Shares: Hope Out Loud

Support from the HOL! (Hope Out Loud!) Capital Campaign saw Advent members participate in dozens of projects – some new, some one-time; some existing ministries were expanded or refreshed. The dedicated members of Advent who truly care about people in need were very active and supportive. One member shared: "When I had some tough years, my church came through for me! That experience changed me in big ways. I vowed that I would get involved more and & pay it forward". Helping others has made me a happier Christian." There are so many completed (and ongoing!) projects. These ministries are wide-ranging and varied – food, clothing, shelter, blankets, books, and prayers. Cookies at Christmastime.

Advent members help men, women, babies, children, people in prison, people in recovery from addictions, hungry people – in our community, our country, and around the world. Members have said that they feel joy in providing the services and the looks on the faces of the recipients reinforce joy there too. Some of the projects receive seed money from Thrivent Action Teams. Some of our favorite ministries and activities are Bombas Socks donations, books and Bibles for Berks County Prison, Christmas Cookies for Common Ground, the Hungry Yard Sale, Family Promise, our Little Free Library and Little Free Pantry, the (new in 2020) Prayer Team, and the many clothing drives.

As one example of the positive impact in the community: The Little Free Pantry was filled and emptied on the same day. We cannot keep it filled fast enough. Through our \$250.00 Thrivent Action Team sponsorship by members of different committees, we can grocery shop and fill our shelves in Advent's grocery shelves. We fill up my grocery cart three times a week and go outside to our Little Free Pantry. Within hours it had been emptied. Praise God for Thrivent and Advent's church members in helping fill our community's bellies with happiness through our wonderful blessed giving! Another goal of the HOL! The campaign was to increase the use of technology in our church life. In the middle of the pandemic, we premiered a fresh, beautiful, new website to tell people about Advent – reaching out in a modern way to share God's word and work with our neighbors, friends, and people who want to learn about God. This new website increases our visibility in the community and provides valuable information for members and visitors alike. Seeing new people attend and join our church brings





