From the Pastor's Desk – March 2024

"God's Good & Gracious Will"

²⁹ He asked them, "But who do you say that I am?"

Peter answered him, "You are the Messiah."

³⁰ And he sternly ordered them not to tell

anyone about him.

³¹ Then he began to teach them that the Son of Man must undergo great suffering and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes and be killed and after three days rise again. ³² He said all this quite openly. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him.

33 But turning and looking at his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said, "Get behind me, Satan! For you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things." (Mark 8:29-33 NRSV-U)

Here's the plan, brothers and sisters. This is how things are going to play out in the coming days. But it made no sense. Peter had just spoken the truth that had come to be on the tip of their tongues. They were coming to believe it but they just weren't sure. Then Jesus asked that question – "Who do you say that I am" – and out it came. "You are Messiah!" There it was, right out in the open. Jesus was the One. He was the long awaited, long anticipated Redeemer of God's people Israel. "You are the Christ, the Son of the Father."

Then Jesus began to talk about things nobody wanted to hear. "The Son of Man must undergo great suffering and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes and be killed and after three days rise again." Talk about suffering, rejection, and death was so shocking that the disciples never even heard the last part, that he would be raised on the third day. How could Messiah die? Not even possible. How could the very leadership of God's people fail to acknowledge him and refuse to accept who

he was? Absurd!

It's hard for us to imagine; us living here so long after the end of the story. When we think about the story of Jesus, about all that God has done for us in Jesus, we just naturally talk about his death AND resurrection – the two parts being inextricably linked as one event. I don't believe it's possible for us to imagine the trauma, the devastation of Jesus' declaration there, much less the reality when it happened, when they watched Jesus be arrested, mocked and beaten, and finally crucified. Their world ended that day, which surely felt like anything but a Good Friday.

But we DO know that Friday wasn't the end of the story. God did, in fact, raise the crucified, dead, and buried Jesus on that third day. Friday became good because Sunday came and Jesus was no longer dead.

This March we find ourselves well on our way in our Lenten journey with Jesus. In these weeks we move from Galilee toward Judea and, finally, to Jerusalem. We watch Jesus. We listen to him. We see the opposition build and grow bold in their desire to be rid of the problem that was Jesus.

Stay with us. Experience it all from Sunday to Sunday and, then, finally to that Holy Week – to the upper room, to Gethsemane, to the cross, and finally – thanks be to God – to the empty tomb. This is the story of God's love for sinners, for folks like you and me. In this we find forgiveness, life, and salvation.



Cultivating Generosity

Throughout the fall our congregations are often focused on stewardship and gratitude for the generosity of members. Folks provide stewardship talks, members complete commitment cards, and sermons are proclaimed to encourage generosity of time, talent and finances. But did you know that our ELCA Congregation and Synod Support Team offers training and recommendations on cultivating generosity?

This past fall, in partnership with the Lake Institute on Faith and Giving, stewardship leaders from eight congregations, representing four ELCA synods, came together for a training series called "Cultivating Generous Congregations" (CGC). Over seven weeks leaders from these eight congregations gathered online as a cohort with the Lake Institute's trained faculty and each other. Cultivating Generous Congregations maps the new landscape of religious giving and provides congregational teams with tools to build a culture of generosity unique to each congregation's needs, challenges, and opportunities. CGC explores theology, the role of adaptive leadership, fiscal transparency, and the importance of giver care, with action steps to impact the exploration of generosity and energize congregational generosity to take the significant and necessary steps to creating lasting cultural change.

Following the final session, the eight congregations received a year of access to the Lake Institute's numerous stewardship resources, as well as optional coaching to assist in the implementation of these practices. Mission Support funds the opportunity for congregations and leaders to learn from stewardship experts and one another and to grow together so that their local mission, and how God is growing generosity, can be told in more effective ways in today's culture.


