

# From the Pastor's Desk

Have you ever noticed that there are strange circumstances that lead you to witnessing to Christ? For me, that comes continually unexpectedly through a group of about thirty people across the world whom I call friends, even though I have not and will likely never meet most of them in person. I found these individuals through a shared love of two of my favorite hobbies — video games and Japanese anime (which you have probably figured out by all of the stickers plastered over the back of my car). The closest of these people is actually in Easton. The furthest is in Denmark. What facilitates our relationship is a computer application that allows us to type and talk to each other in real time.

I mention this because of that group there is one Lutheran (me!), two Catholics, two Baptists, and 25 atheists. The group knows what I do for a living, and so every so often engages with me on questions of significance regarding God, Church, and life. It also helps that I'm the oldest person in the group (I didn't think 39 was old?!). I have probably had some of the greatest witnessing and discussions with individuals who would have never approached me at a church. They would have never approached me in my religious garb. They would have never come to a church event I invited them to. Yet in this weird connection of video games and anime, it opened a conversation. I had a similar experience with a teenager who came into the office about a year ago, not to talk to me about church things, but because he recognized the characters on the back of my car and thought they were cool, which opened the door to talk about this place and what we do here. I walk into stores and clerks are amazed that priests play video games.

When we open ourselves to the surprises of God, I think that God puts us in places where we don't expect that we are being a witness or where we think the experience isn't holy, but then the opportunity arises. People wonder more about you and what values you hold. It is a place to express the love of God in your own life.

I've been friends with these roughly thirty people going on about three years now. One of them even came to my installation service in 2022. The Catholics think I'll be Pope one day (not a chance). The atheists are coming around. Not because a priest lectured them about God, but because a weird friend from halfway across the world modeled the love of God.

May God continue to surprise us with how His love is working through us.

# Nurtured by Community, Sent to Serve: A Candidacy Story

Hi! My name is Heidi Shilanskas, and I am a Deacon Candidate at United Lutheran Seminary, serving at Star of Bethlehem Lutheran Church in Bethlehem, Pa. I am in my final year of Seminary, preparing to start my internship this fall. I am looking forward to graduating in May of 2026 from ULS and starting my call as a Deacon in Northeast Penn Synod.

I have always been involved in Youth and Family Ministry since my own days as a youth, going to Lutheran Youth Fellowship (LYF) Assemblies and participating in Mission District progressive dinners. As a paid youth worker at St. Andrew's Lutheran Church in Easton, I took classes out of the Lutheran Seminary at Gettysburg (now ULS) on youth ministry and learned from professors and leaders in the field how to look beyond the church walls for service projects for youth. After I got married and had my own

children, I started to look for new ways we could participate in church in a culture that doesn't center congregational ministry the same way it did when I was growing up. As a member of St. Mark's in Bethlehem, I started dreaming of new ways to involve children, teens and their parents in ministry beyond the church, making service in our communities a core element of church life.

My candidacy journey started when Pastor Brandon Heavner suggested I'd be a good candidate for ministry. At first, I scoffed at his certainty, but he was tenacious and after many, many discerning conversations about call and passion, I decided to move forward with candidacy. The next step was meeting with Pastor Rachael Dietz, then Executive Associate to the Bishop and Director of Candidacy. Her warmth and encouragement helped me feel secure in the decision to go to Seminary. Without Pastor Brandon and Pastor Rachael, I would never have dreamed God's call on my life would have included Candidacy and Seminary. I am forever grateful for their faith in me.

For my internship, I plan on implementing some of those dreams. I am looking forward to creating "family style" worship services that are intergenerational and interactive so all members can participate in the liturgy. I am planning Bible studies with a focus on service and using our gifts to serve our neighbors.

I will use social media and online tools to create more opportunities to connect with people. Finally, I am hoping to work more closely with the

Interfaith Group on creating ecumenical services projects with our neighbors aren't who just Lutheran, but Presbyterian,

Moravian, Jewish or Muslim, etc. I am excited to find ways to be a part of a wider community of neighbors.

My ministry centered around

## **AUGUST HAPPENINGS**

August was named after a major figure of the ancient Roman World, Augustus Caesar (63 B.C.– A.D. 14). He was the first Roman emperor (though he never claimed the title) and the grandnephew of the previous ruler, Julius Caesar (who named July after himself).

In the Northern Hemisphere, August is the last month of summer and the hottest month of the year.

**August 1**, traditionally known as **Lammas Day**, was an old festival to mark the annual wheat and corn harvest. It was a sort of Thanksgiving (harvest time) in Britain. Lammas also marked the mid-point between the summer solstice and autumn equinox.

August 10 is St. Lawrence's Day. "Fair weather on St. Lawrence's Day presages a fair autumn."

August 11 marks the end of the Dog Days of Summer, which began on July 3.

August 17 is when the Cat Nights begin, harking back to a rather obscure Irish legend concerning witches; this bit of folklore also led to the idea that a cat has nine lives.

**August 19** brings **National Aviation Day**, chosen for the birthday of Orville Wright, who piloted the first recorded flight of a powered heavier-than-air machine in 1903.

August 24 is St. Bartholomew Day. "At St. Bartholomew, there comes cold dew."

**August 26** is **Women's Equality Day**, which celebrates the 1920 ratification of the Nineteenth Amendment and, with it, women's right to vote in the United States.

August's full moon, the full **Sturgeon Moon**, reaches peak illumination on the night of Saturday, August 9. For the best view of the full Moon, look skyward that night!

August is often a wonderful month for stargazing! It's the month of the Perseid meteor shower, which is one of the most prolific showers and reaches its maximum between August 11 and 13. You can still see the Perseids even if they're not at their peak. The shower lasts from about July 23 to August 22, so be sure to keep an eye out.

August's birth flowers are the gladiolus and the poppy.

The **gladiolus** symbolizes strength of character, sincerity, and generosity.

The **poppy** symbolizes eternal sleep, oblivion, and also imagination.

August's primary birthstone is **peridot**, which is said to symbolize strength and healing power, protecting its wearer from nightmares and evil, ensuring harmony and happiness. Babies born in August are lucky to be guarded by peridot's good fortune.

#### Folklore for the Season

- As August, so February.
- Observe on what day in August the first heavy fog occurs, and expect a hard frost on the same day in October.
- If the first week of August is unusually warm, The winter will be white and long.
- So many August fogs, so many winter mists.
- When it rains in August, It raises honey and wine.


